### ubject: Installation of Revised Project Billboards and Markers

In compliance with Memorandum Circular No. 156 dated 18 April 2008 of Executive Secretary Eduardo R. Ermita, "Directing all Heads of Government Agencies and Government-Owned and Controlled Corporations to Adopt the Anti-Poverty Brands of President Gloria Macapagal Arroyo" and Memorandum of Cabinet Secretary Silvestre H. Bello dated 19 August 2008 in order to have a uniform and consistent design in all event materials and outdoor billboards, and for the guidance and information of the citizenry about the on-going and completed infrastructure projects being undertaken by the Department, project billboards and markers shall be installed in all project sites by the concerned implementing offices of the Department adopting the Photo of President Gloria Macapagal-Arroyo with hard hat.

Henceforth, the following guidelines shall be observed in the preparation and installation of the revised billboards and markers:

## A. BILLBOARDS

- The project billboard to be installed in all project sites shall include the photo of President Gloria Macapagal-Arroyo wearing a hard hat; information as to "SOURCE OF FUNDS" shall also be added;
- 2. For each locally funded building project or similar project, Type I Tarpaulin Billboard 4ft x 8ft (Annex "A") shall be installed in front of the project site;
- 3. For each locally funded road/bridge/flood control project, two Type I Tarpaulin Billboard 4ft x 8ft shall be installed one at the beginning and one at the end of the project;
- 4. For each foreign assisted project, Type II Tarpaulin Billboard 8 ft x 8 ft (Annex "B") shall be used at same locations specified for each project category above;
- 5. For locally funded and foreign assisted projects, project tarpaulin billboards, 8ft x 8 ft (Annex C) with PGMA photo with hard hat shall likewise be installed; it shall include a) for completed project photo of the finished project, b) for on-going project photo before and during its construction", and c) for programmed project perspective of the project; and
- 6. Specifically, for road projects with a minimum length of 3 kilometers, 2ft x 4ft project tarpaulin banners (Annex "D") shall also be installed 500 meters interval at either direction.

### B. MARKERS


- The marker to be installed in all completed projects shall be made of 3/32 inch thick brass plate, 18" x 24" in size with black sunk lettering. It shall include the name of project, location, personages and source of fund(s) as shown in Annexes "E" (locally funded) & "F" (foreign assisted);
- 2. For building and similar projects, it shall be strategically located at the front wall of the structure as shown in Annex "G. 1";
- 3. For 2-lane bridge and similar projects, it shall be installed at the right wing wall as shown in Annex "G.2"; and
- 4. For 4-lane bridge with median of not less than 2.0 m and similar projects, it shall be installed at the median as shown in Annex "G.3".








## LOCATION OF PROJECT MARKER


